Water is life. Yet major water challenges — water scarcity, water affordability and resilience of infrastructure to climate change — continue to escalate around the world.

We partnered with other water sector leaders to develop the Reservoir Center for Water Solutions and find innovative ways to help communities overcome these challenges together. Over the past six months, we convened local, state and national agencies, water utilities, nonprofits, private companies, members of Congress and the Washington, D.C. community to brainstorm new approaches, drive action, educate and raise awareness. We collaborated through:

- Seminars on climate resiliency and policy with live broadcast discussions featuring utility leaders from across Europe and attendees of COP27 in Egypt.
- Career development panels with students and young professionals interested in pursuing careers in water and sustainability.
- An interactive session featuring a diverse group of female water leaders sharing their experiences in the sector, with a discussion broadcast live from World Water Week in Stockholm.

- Two informational webinars on the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, focusing on available resources to small and underserved communities.
- Park and river cleanups to benefit the local Anacostia watershed.

As we look ahead to 2023, the Reservoir Center will continue to serve as a hub dedicated to overcoming the greatest water challenges of our time.

This collaboration happens because of our 39 partners who've joined us on this journey to date and the many individuals who make the Reservoir Center possible – people like you. YOUTH PROGRAM

Mission: Engage young people from around the world in events that facilitate dialogue, education, and connection in solving the world's water challenges. Youth have played a critical role in driving the climate movement forward, and our top priority is making sure that youth voices are included in the Reservoir Center's global conversations around water.



RISING WATER PROFESSIONALS
